# Classical WSMR to broadcast past productions of Sarasota Opera

Sarasota, FL – Six popular Sarasota Opera past productions will be broadcast on Classical WSMR radio beginning Saturday, October 23<sup>rd</sup> at 1pm Eastern Time: Verdi's *Otello* (2012), D'Albert's *Tiefland* (2018) on October 30<sup>th</sup>, Puccini's *La bohème* (2020) on November 6<sup>th</sup>, Montemezzi's *The Love of Three Kings (L'amore dei tre rei)* (2017) on November 13<sup>th</sup>, Verdi's *Rigoletto* (2019) on November 20<sup>th</sup>, and Rimsky-Korsakov's *The Golden Cockerel* (2015) on November 27<sup>th</sup>. The broadcasts will be hosted by WSMR Music Director and Host Russell Gant and introduced by Sarasota Opera Artistic Director Victor DeRenzi and General Director Richard Russell. Listeners can tune-in to Classical WSMR at 89.1 and 103.9 on the radio, listen online at WSMR.org, or through the WUSF Public Media app.

Sarasota Opera's Fall Season on stage begins on Friday, October 29th with Gioachino Rossini's *The Silken Ladder (La scala di seta)*, a 90-minute romantic comedy, with six performances through November 13, 2021. Shemakha, Grigory Soloviov as Didon, Timur Bekbosunov as The Astrologer, Jon Jurgens and Kenneth Stavert as the King's sons, William Roberts as General Polkan, Riley Svatos as the Golden Cockerel, and Daryl Freedman as the Housekeeper, with the Sarasota Opera Orchestra. Running time: 2 hours.

## ABOUT SARASOTA OPERA

This is Sarasota Opera's 63rd Season of bringing world-class opera to Florida's Gulf Coast. The company was launched in 1960 in the historic 320-seat Asolo Theater on the grounds of Sarasota's Ringling Museum of Art. In 1984 the company moved into the former A.B. Edwards Theater—now the Sarasota Opera House. Since then, the company has gained an international reputation as one of the leading regional opera companies in the U.S. through initiatives such as the Masterworks Revival Series and the Verdi Cycle. The company's Sarasota Youth Opera is the most comprehensive Youth Program in the U.S. The Sarasota Opera House, which underwent a \$20 million renovation and rehabilitation in 2007, has been called "one of America's finest venues for opera" by Musical America. Since 1983, the company has been under the artistic leadership of Victor DeRenzi and administrative leadership of General Director Richard Russell since 2012.
