#### MUSICAL RESPONSES TO THE WAR IN UKRAINE

It's rare for opera and symphony companies to become political. But the invasion of Ukraine has spurred the classical (and popular) music universe to voice its anguish and anger over this heinous act.

Opera houses and symphony orchestras have fired singers, conductors and others over their allegiance to Russia, or their refusal to condemn the invasion. The Metropolitan Opera has severed ties with Anna Netrebko, and the Munich Philharmonic fired its chief conductor Valery Gergiev.

Opera houses and symphony halls have draped the Ukrainian flag or shone blue and yellow lights on their facades. Programs have been cancelled. The San Francisco Opera postponed its Opera Aficionado session "Opera in Soviet Russia." They have begun their programs with the Ukrainian national anthem.

Classical musicians in Ukraine have shown the world the wonder and strength of music to draw attention to injustice. Singers from Odessa Opera joined together to sing "Va pensiero" on the street in front of the Odessa Opera House. <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ydZnTEAJClc">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ydZnTEAJClc</a> Since it was first performed in 1841, Verdi's chorus from the opera *Nabucco* has been a rallying cry for displaced people and people under siege. The Metropolitan Opera notably performed *A Concert for Ukraine*. #### MOG EVENTS FROM MARCH

The season launches in the fall with Domenico Cimarosa's *The Secret Marriage (Il matrimonio segreto*). A social-climbing father wants his eldest daughter to marry an aristocrat—but there are complications. The comic opera is not often seen, and it will have five performances: Oct. 28 and 30, Nov. 8, 10 and 12, in its Sarasota Opera debut.

Sarasota Youth Opera will present Dean Burry's *The Secret World of Og*, last seen here in 2016, on Nov. 5 and 6. The story follows a group of siblings venturing into a dark subterranean world to rescue their baby brother and cat.

The 2023 Winter Opera Festival of four operas opens Feb. 18 with Puccini's popular tragedy *Madama Butterfly*. The tale of a young geisha who meets with heartbreak after being swept off her feet by an American Naval officer will receive 10 performances, Feb. 18, 21, 23, 26, and March 1, 4, 10, 15, 21 and 24.

Mozart's most famous opera, the comic/tragic masterpiece *Don Giovanni*, last seen in Sarasota in 2011, *Don Giovanni* tells the story of the infamous lover Don Juan, who leaves a trail of heartache in his wake, in eight performances, Feb. 25 and 28, and March 2, 5, 8, 12, 18 and 25.

*Ernani*, a Verdi opera not seen here since 1997 tells the story of the bandit Ernani who has lost his land, wealth and title, and faces competition in the pursuit of his true love, Elvira. Six performances, March 11, 14, 16, 18, 22 and 26.

Finally, Jules Massenet's *Thérèse* will close out the winter festival season, March 17, 19, 21, 23 and 25. It centers on a love triangle during the French Revolution, and it will be not only a Sarasota Opera debut, but a U.S. professional premiere. Five performances only.

Casting for the season will be announced at a later date, but in the meantime, for more information on the season visit <u>sarasotaopera.org</u> or call (941) 328-1300. Subscriptions will be available for renewal March 28, 2022; single tickets will go on sale online Aug. 1.
